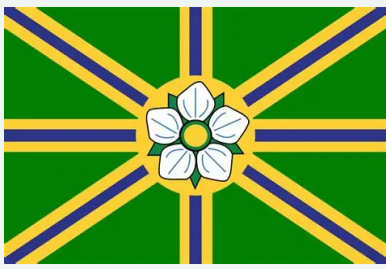


WELCOME TO ABBOTSFORD



Public Library

- At Abbotsford Community Library, individuals can discover books, eBooks, CDs and more for all ages - with some in different languages.
- Most public libraries contain services for individuals with disabilities.
- Public libraries have various services to access, such as activities for children and workshops for adults.

Education

- The Settlement Workers in Schools Program supports children of newcomers and their families to settle in schools and communities.
- Schools offer newcomers English Language Learning classes along with their regular classes to support them in learning English.
- Adult learners may graduate from high school by completing either B.C. Certificate of Graduation or B.C. Adult Graduation Diploma
- Adult Basic Education, Adult Upgrading Programs, and Adult Special Education are programs which support adults with their education.



Employment

- WorkBC allows individuals to navigate career options, possible jobs, and understand the local labor market.
- Through WorkBC, individuals can have an overview of occupations in BC along with their educational requirements, industry highlights, and annual earnings.
- Career Paths for Skilled Immigrants program supports new immigrants in finding employment with the experience and education they hold.

Public Transportation

- BC Transit provides individuals with bus services.
- Individuals may purchase a bus pass or a book of tickets.
- Children under 5 years old, accompanied by an adult, may ride for free.
- Full-time students and seniors (65+) are eligible to pay a lower price with identification.
- Individuals with disabilities may also receive a special pass.

BC Driver's License

- Must be 16 years or older to apply for a license.
- Individuals under 19 years older must have a parent or guardian sign the application.
- Individuals may not need to take the knowledge or road test if they are from another province of Canada, United States, Japan, Germany, South Korea, Austria, or Switzerland.
- To take knowledge test, road test, and apply for a BC driver's license, go to ICBC located on South Fraser Way.
